



FINANCIAL AID AND PROCEDURES

Investing in a Catholic education at St. Viator School is an investment toward the success of your child's future. We believe that the highest quality education is only possible in a community that welcomes all. Children will be better prepared for the world when they have spent their critical early years learning and growing in a diverse community of peers.

We recognize that making this a priority requires a financial obligation that not all families can afford to do. St. Viator is committed to making financial aid available to new and returning students. Application for admission to St. Viator should not be discouraged because of affordability of tuition, we believe in giving every child the opportunity to receive a high-quality Catholic education.

Parents of students receiving assistance are required to

- pay all fees: student, technology, and lunch supervisor
- pay for Mandatory Fundraising Raffle
- be responsible for a portion of their child's tuition
- complete forms and participate in outside scholarship opportunities the school supplies
- participate in some of the many volunteer opportunities in our St. Viator community.

Financial aid is determined by a committee, with a structured plan put in place, on a case-by-case basis. Current families receiving financial aid must re-apply to receive financial aid each year, annual renewal is not automatic or guaranteed. As long as a family continues to demonstrate need and is in good standing, St. Viator will continue to attempt to meet that need. All information is kept strictly confidential.

To be considered for financial aid you are required to:

- apply through FACTS by going to online.factsmgt.com/grant-and-aid or click on the FACTS logo on our website
- submit all financial documentation to FACTS
- have your current year tuition in good standing
- register your child for the year you are applying.
